Below are participation numbers for FFF aquatic and angling education programs. These numbers result from hands on fly fishing and aquatic education programs conducted on site at the Fly Fishing Discovery Center in Livingston, and through classroom visits to schools all across Montana. All programs are free of charge and are provided on a first come first serve basis.

Topics include but are not limited to the following: Fly casting instruction, fly tying instruction, fly fishing instruction, fly fishing equipment loan program, aquatic macroinvertebrate lessons, water quality, fish dissection, Montana native fishes, invasive species lessons, riparian ecology, and fish biology.

FFF is a partner in the “Hooked on Fishing” program administered by Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks. The FFF serves as the fly fishing educators for this popular state wide program across Montana. These programs and positive results are made possible because of the FFF partnership with MFWP.
